**AN ORDINANCE REDUCING THE LATE PAYMENT PENALTIES FOR WATER AND SEWER BILLS TO TEN PERCENT OF THE CURRENT BILL WITH THE PENALTIES TO BE PROPORTIONED BETWEEN THE SEWER AND WATER BILL AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Council of the Village of Sabina, Clinton County, Ohio:

**Section One:** Late payment penalties for the combined water and sewer bill, is ten percent of the combined sewer and water bill;

**Section Two:** The late payment penalty paid shall be proportioned between the water and sewer funds;

**Section Three:** This ordinance shall not affect or restrict the shut off policy of the Village for non-payment of water and sewer bills;

**Section Four:** The reconnection fee shall be thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) during regular working hours and fifty dollars (\$50.00) after regular working hours and on the weekends;

**Section Five:** By the passage of this Ordinance, all prior Ordinances on the matter of late payment penalties are hereby repealed;

**Section Six:** In accordance with R.C 731.17 (A) (2) the requirement that this Ordinance be read on three (3) different days is dispensed with by affirmative vote of at least 3/4 of the members of Council.

**Section Seven:** In accordance with R.C. 731.30 this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Village and shall therefore be in full force and effect from and immediately upon affirmative vote of at least 2/3 of the members of Council. This Ordinance is declared as an emergency so that the Village may have a uniform policy for water and sewer bills. This Ordinance shall go into immediate effect upon passage.
