AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN ADDITIONAL (SUPPLEMENTAL) ONE HALF OF ONE PER CENT (0.50%) LEVY ON MUNICIPAL TAX INCOME, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017, FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAINTAINING THE SABINA, OHIO POLICE DEPARTMENT AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, the amount of taxes which may be raised by the annual income tax levied by the Village of Sabina as outlined through the Village of Sabina Tax Ordinance (Ordinance 2004-16) will be insufficient to provide adequate funds necessary to maintain Police Department services for the Village of Sabina, Clinton County, Ohio; and

Whereas, an Ordinance authorizing an income tax greater than 1 percent (1%) must be passed and filed with the Board of Elections of Clinton County in order to permit Council of the Village of Sabina, Ohio to consider the levy of such an income tax increase pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 718.04.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Sabina, State of Ohio by waiving the three readings and by two-thirds or more of the members elected thereto concurring:

- 1. That it is necessary to increase the current annual income tax rate of one percent (1%) to a rate of one and one-half percent (1½%). The purpose of the increase is for maintaining Police services for Sabina, Ohio. One hundred percent (100%) of revenue generated by said increase will be designated to support the Sabina, Ohio Police Department.
- 2. That the one and one-half percent (1 ½%) annual tax rate shall commence on July 1, 2017, in compliance with ORC 718.04, if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof.
- 3. That the current credit pursuant to Income Tax Ordinance 2004-16 which grants a credit to residents of the municipal corporation for all or a portion of the taxes paid to any municipal corporation, in this state or elsewhere, by the resident or by a pass-through entity owned, directly or indirectly, by a resident, on the resident's distributive or proportionate share of the income of the pass-through entity will apply up to the one and one-half percent (1 ½%) income tax rate.
- 4. That the question of such tax levy shall be submitted to the electors of the Village of Sabina, Clinton County, Ohio at the Spring Primary Election to be held therein on May 2, 2017.
- 5. That the Fiscal Officer is hereby directed to file a copy of this Ordinance with the board of elections, Clinton County, Ohio at least ninety (90) days before the date of the election.
