AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING HIRING THE PART-TIME AS NEEDED POSITION OF BACKHOE OPERATOR AS AND DECLARED TO BE AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the current heavy equipment operator has resigned his position with the Village of Sabina and the Village is in need of an immediate as needed replacement.

WHEREAS, the Village of Sabina seeks to hire a part-time as needed employee with the Village who has operating experience and knowledge of the position.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SABINA, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1: Andy Kenney is hired for the position of Part-time as needed backhoe operator in the Department of Utilities for the Village of Sabina. Andy Kenney shall receive compensation in the amount of \$20.00 per hour, payable bi-weekly with no benefits other than OPERS.

Section 2: This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare. The reason for such necessity is that the Village can not operate properly with the loss of an employee as an operator readily available on hand in the Utilities Department on an as needed basis. Therefore this ordinance shall go into immediate effect.



Ordinance No. 2017-3Passed January 26,, 2017

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH McCARTY ASSOCIATES, LLC TO PROVIDE ENGINEERING SERVICES TO ENABLE BIDDING AND RECONSTRUCTION OF THE JEFFERSON STREET STORM SEWER AND DECLARE AN EMERGENCY FOR THE IMMEDIATE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC PEACE, HEALTH AND SAFETY OF THE VILLAGE.

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Board of Commissioners have committed a CDBG Critical Infrastructure Grant and CDBG Allocation Funds to the Sabina Jefferson Street Storm Sewer Reconstruction Project, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Sabina has by Resolution #1086 committed funds for the Jefferson Street Storm Sewer Reconstruction Project, and

WHEREAS, this project will be a great benefit to Sabina residents.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE Sabina Village Council that the Village enter into an agreement with McCarty Associates, LLC of Washington CH, Ohio to provide Engineering Services to enable bidding and reconstruction of the Storm Sewer under Jefferson Street, Solutions Ave. and beyond between US 22/3 and Wilson Creek.

Recent observations of washout of soil between the storm sewer and street and between the storm sewer and earth surface have raised concerns for potential caverns along the pathway of the sewer bringing this project to a higher priority than expected, therefore this ordinance is declared an emergency necessary for the peace, health and safety of the village and shall be in force and effect upon affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the members of Council.


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
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
